
Brandon Horrocks is in his final semester of the doctoral program in Instrumental Conducting at the University of Utah and is excited to be returning a second time to conduct the SummerArts Concerto concert with the Salt Lake Symphony where he serves as the Assistant Conductor. In addition to this role, Brandon is the Principal Graduate Conductor for the two University orchestras. In the Salt Lake community, Brandon is the Music Director and Conductor of the Wasatch Symphony, and is also the Music Director and

Conductor of the Utah Philharmonic Orchestra.

A vocalist by training, Brandon maintains connection to the choral community as a choir section leader with the Cathedral of the Madeleine Choir in Salt Lake City and works at the Madeleine Choir School as adjunct music staff. As an active choral singer he has performed with Utah Chamber Artists, Salt Lake Choral Artists, La Jolla Symphony and Chorus, and San Diego Master Chorale.

Brandon holds a Master's Degree in Orchestral Conducting and Bachelors of Music degree in Vocal Performance from the University of Utah where he studies conducting with Dr. Robert Baldwin. He studied voice and opera with Dr. Seth Keeton, Dr. David Power and Dr. Robert Breault.

As a collaborative pianist and chamber musician, she was invited to the Saarburg Chamber Music Festival in 2017 and has been a piano accompanist with the Salt Lake Chinese Choir since 2018, University of Utah Chamber Choir and A Capella Choir since 2022.

Zibo Wang has had a passion for music since he was 4, which was when he was first introduced to piano. He became fascinated with the cause and effect relationship of pushing down a wooden button-like object colored as either black or white and observing the hammer hitting the string. As he advanced through his life, he was able to

create melodies with just pressing down keys, pleasing the ears. Progressing steadily, Zibo has taken many awards; in more recent years, he has taken 2nd prize in the Pacific Stars International Competition of 2022, 1st Prize in the Summer Arts Competition of 2022, 1st Prize in the Salt Lake City Piano Competition of 2023, and many more. He has also been able to perform with symphonies such as the American Fork Symphony, American West Symphony, and Salt Lake Symphony. Now, he is a 15-year-old sophomore attending school at Skyline High in Utah. He studies piano with Jie Deng and Ning Lu from the University of Utah. He currently occupies himself in many extracurriculars, such as skiing, FBLA, DECA, debate, SciOly, and more. He also enjoys playing the violin and is in the Skyline High Philharmonic Orchestra. He is very grateful for his parents pushing him through, as well as his two teachers for shaping his musical pathway.



Jamison Ford is a Junior at Olympus High School. He has studied piano since the age of 6, with teachers Jan Marshall and Merla Little. Jamison is so grateful for this opportunity to perform with the Salt Lake Symphony, and to stand alongside these other incredible soloists.
