Fred Lerdahl

Composer and music theorist Fred Lerdahl studied at Lawrence University, Princeton University, and Tanglewood. He taught at UC/ Berkeley, Harvard, and Michigan, and from 1991 to 2018 he was Fritz Reiner Professor of Musical Composition at Columbia University, where he directed the composition program for 20 years.

His music has been commissioned and performed by major chamber ensembles and orchestras in the United States and around the world, and he has been a resident composer at leading institutions and festivals. Three of his works—*Time after Time*, the Third String Quartet, and *Arches*—were finalists for the Pulitzer Prize in music. His music is published by Schott Music Corporation and has been widely recorded for various labels, including Bridge Records, which is producing an ongoing series of his music. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Letters.

His book *A Generative Theory of Tonal Music*, co-authored with linguist Ray Jackendoff, is a foundational document in the cognitive science of music. His subsequent book, *Tonal Pitch Space*, builds on ideas proposed in the earlier book. A third book, *Composition and Cognition: Reflections on Contemporary Music and the Musical Mind* brings together his dual activity as composer and theorist.
